Give Them a Ring

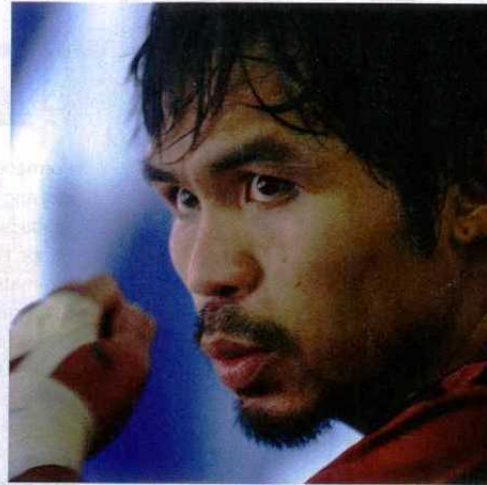
Two of the world's most popular fighters top the most-anticipated fight card in months when **Manny "Pacman" Pacquiao** faces **Miguel Cotto** this week at MGM Grand Garden Arena.

Pacquiao (49-3-2, 37 KOs), of General Santos City, Philippines, has won six world titles in six weight divisions. He followed up a spectacular 2008, in which he defeated Juan Manuel Marquez, David Diaz and Oscar De La Hoya, with a second-round knockout of defending welterweight champion Ricky Hatton in May.

Cotto (34-1, 27 KOs), of Caguas, Puerto Rico, was the WBO junior welterweight and won his second welterweight title earlier this year with a fifth-round knockout of Michael Jennings. A title defense against Joshua Clottey in June was a bloody split decision.

"These are two real warriors." Top Rank promoter Bob Arum told *espn.com*. "Whichever way this fight goes, I think it's going to be a classic because of the way these guys fight. There will be a lot of engagement ... If you want blood and action and excitement, this is the fight." —*Paul Szydelko*
